**Minutes**  
**January 9, 2007**

The meeting began with an invocation by Chaplain Richard Edmonston. The minutes for January 9, 2007, and the agenda for this meeting were approved unanimously.

**Treasurer's Report:** Karen Myers reported that the capital fund has a balance of \$19,124.48, while the checking account has a balance of \$12,546.99. The payment for the concession upgrade has not been made yet. Karen reminded everyone to get their program ad and sign money in as soon as possible. The report was approved unanimously.

**Old Business:** President Mayorca thanked everyone who had worked on the fish fry and 100 inning game for making it such a success. The new hood has been installed in the concession stand, but the suppression system is still being completed. He announced that Pam Whiddon has volunteered for and been selected by the Board for the First Vice-President position. He also reminded everyone that Tom LaConte fills the new Webmaster position on the Board. Karen Myers, chair of the program committee, then addressed the need for program ads as soon as possible. A lot more will have to be submitted before a program can be done - \$2900 need to be raised in program ads before it can be produced. She added that she has not received any information from Senior Parents for Senior Ads. The deadline for program ads is February 28.

Andrew asked for members to volunteer for the banquet committee. He encouraged underclassmen parents to volunteer since that time of year – early May --- is busy for senior families. He added that the Senior sign has been ordered and should be up within about a week. Annual passes will be available at home games -- \$30 for adults and \$20 for students. They cannot be used for away games or the Puma Classic – but with the number of home games, it is still a bargain! Every Friday home game with any of the teams is Orange and Blue night, which means students can get in free if they wear orange and blue.

The Puma Classic is scheduled for April 2-5 and volunteers will be needed to work concessions. Tate, which sponsors the tournament, handles the gate. A new schedule will be put in the concession stand. Andrew added that a workday will be scheduled before the tournament since there is a lot of out-of-state participation. The Varsity Trip to Mississippi is March 2-3 – the team will leave at 7:30am on March 2 and will be staying at the American Best Value Inn. Parents are encouraged to make their own reservations as soon as possible if they plan on going.

Coaches Report: Coach first addressed the recent weather, saying that this was the first time games had been called because of cold. The Tate Varsity game is tentatively rescheduled for March 29. Coach would like to make arrangements to take the JV team to Mississippi with the Varsity team so that they can make up some of the games they missed. This would mean more funds, approximately \$1500 - but they would play other JV teams in Mississippi. Stan Wehmeier made a motion to allocate the necessary funds for the JV team to go. Doug Adams seconded. There was some discussion that this would put the trip slightly over budget, but money had been returned for the uniforms that were ordered but were the wrong sizes. The motion passed unanimously.

Andrew added that Senior Night is April 17 and volunteers are needed to organize it. A variety of things need to be arranged, including inviting certain people, preparing statements about each senior, a photographer, an announcer, flowers for the mothers, and a schedule.

Parents were reminded to turn volunteer forms into the school if they haven't already. Each parent must complete the form each academic year in order to volunteer with the school. There was also a discussion of the flagpole that was being donated to the school. Shields Electric was also volunteering to install it. Input was requested regarding the size of flag needed as well as where it could be obtained.

It was moved and seconded to adjourn the meeting –a motion which passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 6:50 pm. The next meeting is scheduled for March 5, 2007, at 6pm.
